Being on time for school in the morning

We have more and more children being late in the mornings, though we understand parking might be an issue, this doesn't seem to be the main reason. A reminder that the gate for Chestnut and Oak opens at 8:35 and shuts at 8:45 with all children being in by this time.

Willow children can line up at 8:35 when Mrs Gough comes out to greet the line and have until 8:45 to come through the front door.

Maple Children should be all lined up outside the front door by 8:45 ready to all go in.

It is so important that children come in with their class and are in on time. In the first few minutes of the day, as they socialise with their friends, are given important instructions, answer the attendance and dinner registers and will complete a morning activity which may be spellings or finishing work from the previous day. It sets the tone for the rest of the morning and helps children settle back into the school routine.

Reminder - Sports Day is Monday 3rd July, Maple and Willow children in the morning from 9:30 and Chestnut and Oak in the afternoon from 1:00pm. All parents and grandparents are welcome to watch, bring chairs, picnic blankets and picnics.
