Spotlight on- Dyslexia

I have had quite a few parents talk to me recently about whether their child might be dyslexic due to a difficulty in spelling and/or reading as well as in other areas.

Research shows that 1 in 10 people could show signs of being dyslexic and it is a lifelong condition that can present challenges on a daily basis, but children and adults can be given support and a toolkit of resources they can use as learners to help.

Dyslexia is about information processing. Dyslexic people may have difficulty processing and remembering information they see and hear, which can affect learning and the acquisition of literacy skills. Dyslexia can also impact on other areas such as organisational skills.

It is important to remember that there are positives to thinking differently. Many dyslexic people show strengths in areas such as reasoning and in visual and creative fields.
