Dear Parents and Carers,

We cannot believe that we have come to the last term of this academic year and our final term together as a class. The children have been such a joy to teach this year and have gelled together as a group so well. We are so proud of each and every one of them for the progress they have made individually and for the barriers they have overcome.

Our new big question for this term is, 'I wonder where animals live?' Through this, we will be learning about the habitat different animals live or lived in and how they differ. We will be focusing on minibeasts, animals that live in the African plains, in rainforests and woodlands as well as under the sea creatures and dinosaurs.

As you know, we have organised a trip to the **Bristol Zoo Project on Tuesday 10th June** which will be a brilliant opportunity for the children see wild animals up close and learn about their natural habitat.

Forest School

Forest School will continue this term for Maple children on a **Thursday** afternoon.

PE

PE this term will be on a **Monday** and **Tuesday**, so please ensure children come to school in their PE kits on these days.

Reading and Writing

This term we will be continuing to focus on Level 4 phonics where the children read and write words containing consonant blends. Please support your child by practising their sounds, reading with them daily and helping them to read the tricky words sent home. We will continue to hear your child read each week in school and change their book each time they read, providing there is a note in their reading record to say they have read. In addition we are encouraging children to write independent captions and sentences for different purposes, using their phonic knowledge to write unfamiliar words, remembering to start with a capital letter, putting a finger space between each word and ending with a full stop.

Maths

This term, we will be consolidating our learning and applying our skills and knowledge to solve problems. This will include sharing objects into equal groups, doubling, counting in 2's and 10's, following and giving directions and creating number stories involving addition and subtraction. Being able to apply maths skills is vital to embed and deepen the children's knowledge and understanding and is crucial for them to be ready for year 1 maths.










A few housekeeping things and reminders:
